Details

The St John of God Training Centre was established by the St John of God Brothers in 1953. It housed around 100 Catholic boys aged 7 to 16 with mild intellectual disabilities, including State wards unable to live with their parents.

The St John of God Training Centre occupied the former site of the Methodist Homes for Children in Cheltenham and was approximately 20 acres. Subsidised by the Mental Hygiene Authority, the Brother's aimed to establish a home, special school and training centre.

An article published by the support group Broken Rites makes the point that

Many SJOG inmates, especially wards of state, had behavioural or learning difficulties and were not necessarily born with an intellectual disability, although they certainly became educationally disadvantaged through their incarceration at St John of God.

A commemorative plaque on the site in Cheltenham reads:

Southland commemorates the service to children given on this site by Methodist Homes for Children 1892-1953 and the St. John of God Training Centre 1953-1967.

By the 1950s the property was bought by the Catholic Church to eventually become the boys' home run by the St John of God Brothers. After 1966, the land was sold and later became the Southland shopping centre.]

Methodist Homes for Children (1891 - c. 1953)

The St John of God Training Centre was established on the former site of Methodist Homes for Children. Date: 1953 -

- <u>Churinga Special Residential School (1967 1990)</u>
 In 1966 the Cheltenham site was sold to Myer and associated interests, as the Brothers prepared to reestablish the home at Greensborough. The new home was called Churinga and catered for boys with severe intellectual disabilities.
- <u>Yarra View Training Farm (1957 1967?)</u> The 'Yarra View' Training Farm provided a 'sheltered workshop' environment for boys with mild and moderate intellectual disabilities over the age of 16 years.
- <u>Marian Lodge Training Centre (1953 1967)</u>
 Marian Lodge catered for boys with moderate intellectual disabilities unable to follow a special schooling program but able to benefit from other training.
