## Details

The Salvation Army Home for Girls, Yeronga, was operated by the Salvation Army. It opened in 1898 and closed in 1942. In 1941 there were 25 children under 16 years old in the home. In March 1942, 41 girls were evacuated from Yeronga to James Horton House, Toowomba, due to fears Brisbane would be bombed by the Japanese. These girls subsequently remained in Toowoomba.

The Industrial School for girls was established under the *Reformatories and Industrial Schools Act* 1898, and licensed under the *State Children Act* 1911 on 31 December 1911. The Salvation Army Home, Yeronga, was licensed under *The Infant Life Protection Act* 1905 on 16 March 1925.
