

Kali Boys' Hostel

1971 - 1972

Details

Kali Boys' Hostel was opened by the United Aborigines Mission at Westbourne Park in 1971. Run by the UAM under the control of the Department, it operated as accommodation for Aboriginal boys attending secondary school. It initially accommodated four boys. In 1972 Kali Boys Hostel became a government run small group home known as Kali Cottage.

Kali Boys' Hostel opened on 24 May 1971, at Westbourne Park, as accommodation for Aboriginal boys attending secondary school. The Federal branch of the United Aborigines Mission ran Kali Boys' Hostel under the control and supervision of the Department for Social Welfare and Aboriginal Affairs.

In 1972 Kali Boys Hostel was taken over by the government and became a small group home known as Kali Cottage.

National Redress Scheme for people who have experienced institutional child sexual abuse

In 2021, the South Australian government has agreed to be a funder of last resort for this institution. This means that although the institution is now defunct, it is participating in the National Redress Scheme, and the government has agreed to pay the institution's share of costs of providing redress to a person (as long as the government is found to be equally responsible for the abuse a person experienced).
