Details

The Dominican Sisters belong to an order of nuns, priests and laity inspired by St Dominic, the founder of the order and St Catherine of Siena who is referred to as the co-founder. The Order was established in Europe in 1221. In 1868 the Bishop of Adelaide invited seven Dominican sisters from Cabra, a school in Ireland, to South Australia to open a convent and school, the Cabra Dominican Convent. This school included the Cabra Dominican Convent Boarding House.
