

Memorial Cottage, Roleystone

1942 - 1944

Details

Memorial Cottage was the name given to the Sister Kate's Children's Cottage home during its wartime evacuation to Roleystone in the Darling Ranges outside Perth. This cottage was purchased with funds donated from England in memory of Archdeacon Lefroy, hence the name 'Memorial Cottage'. After a couple of years, the children and staff moved back to Queen's Park.

Description: 'Memorial Cottage Roleystone' is a photograph from the City of Armadale's Municipal Heritage Inventory Review. It shows the building that Sister Kate's Children's Home used during the World War Two evacuation from the Queen's Park site. At that time, the building was known as 'Memorial Cottage'. This photograph shows how the building looked in 2008, as a private home. The Heritage Inventory records the name of the building as 'Darjeeling', which was its original name.
