## Details

The Methodist Overseas Mission, a department of the Methodist Church of Australia, was established around 1930. Previously it was known as the Methodist Missionary Society of Australasia. It established missions and Homes in the Northern Territory and Western Australia during the early and mid twentieth century. The Methodist Overseas Mission became part of the Uniting Church of Australia after it was established in 1977.

- Methodist Church of Western Australia (1829 1977) The Methodist Overseas Mission was part of the broader Methodist Church and was involved in out of home care in WA. However, it was not an agency of the Methodist Conference in Perth.
- Uniting Church in Australia, Northern Synod (1977 current)
- <u>United Church, North Australia (1946 1977)</u> The United Church, North Australia took over the work of the Methodist Overseaes Mission when the Croker Island Mission closed and children were moved to Darwin. Date: 1968 - 1977
- <u>Somerville Homes (1965 1981)</u>
  Somerville Homes Incorporated established cottage homes in Darwin for children from the Methodist Overseas Mission Home on Croker Island.
