GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

The discipline enforded must be mild and firm. All degeading and injurious punishments should be avoided. The "boxing" of ohildren's ears is strictly forbidden.

Corporal punishment may as a last resort, be inflicted in the presence of a witness. by the Officer-in Charge of Boys

Corporal punishment may be administered for absconding, offences against morality, for gross impertinence, or for wilful and persistant disobedience: but not for trivial breaches of discipline.

Every case of Corporal punishment, as well as that of light punishment, must be recorded in this Book immediately after the infliction thereof, giving date, detail of the offence, number of strokes administered, and the name; of witness present.

For offences other than those mentioned above, the following light punishments may be given_.

for Forfeiture of priviliges; bReduction in quality or quantity of food. c. Confinement in a Room. but not in darkness.

As th B. Eight ounces of Bread and water may be given instead of the ordin ary meal. but no child must be deprived of two meals in succession.
